Have you Registered on our Web Site Yet?

We announced in March of this year that we would stop sending paper copies of the quarterly contribution reports in the fourth quarter of this year. At that time, about a third of our members were already using our web site to complete their quarterly contribution reports and now we're up to 75%.

If you still haven't had a chance, please take the time to register before the changeover occurs later this year. If you have lost or misplaced the registration information that was previously mailed to all members, please contact Mike Pennanen at 800-968-9675, ext. 2950 and he can provide you with your PIN.

It only takes a few minutes to register and you can also provide your PIN to your payroll provider if they will be completing your report. Once you have your PIN, follow the instructions below to register on our web site:

1. Go to 501alliance.org
2. On the right-hand side, scroll down and click on "Don't have an account?"
3. On the registration page, create a username, enter your e-mail address and enter your UIA number and PIN.
4. Click on the "Sign-up" button and you will receive an e-mail with two links.
5. Click on the first link and you can either use the password that is displayed or you can delete it and create your own. We suggest creating a password that will be easier to remember. Next, click on the "Reset Password" button.
6. The next screen will indicate that your password has been reset and click on the "Log-in" link. On this screen, enter your username and password that you just created.
7. Click on "Log-in" and you will be directed to the home page of our web site.

Once logged-in, a menu should now be displayed on the right-hand side of the home page, with all of the available features listed. Once you're ready to complete your report, click on the "Quarterly Contribution Report" link. Once completed, you do not need to provide a copy with your payment but please note your UIA employer number on the front of your check.

And the Winner is...

From a field of 20 candidates, the winner of the Harry and Shirley Klein Legal Scholarship award was announced at the annual meeting in May. Ms. Stephanie Fong was the winner and she was presented with a check for \$1,000.

She is currently enrolled in the Dual American & Canadian J.D. program at the University of Detroit Mercy School of Law and University of Windsor Faculty of Law. Ms. Fong is also the Associate Editor for the law review at the University of Windsor and has been named a Lysaght & Stewart Scholar for being among the top twenty students entering the Dual J.D. Class of 2018.

The 501 Alliance and Human Services for Workers Compensation boards established this scholarship in honor of Harry Klein. Harry was a nonprofit advocate and was instrumental in establishing legislation for an unemployment compensation group-reimbursing plan.

This scholarship was funded by contributions from the two boards and is posted at various law schools in Michigan. Candidates submit essays indicating how their background and qualifications fit with what Harry Klein tried to do with his life. Members of the board, along with a family member and judges, form the selection committee.
